

FAQs from Christians

Frequently Anticipated Questions*

*These questions were not asked; they were only anticipated

(1) We certainly agree with you that the coronavirus shots (and passports based on them) are a terrible idea and must be refused. But why don't you see that the vaccine passports are the Mark of the Beast and that this clearly proves that Christianity is true? Since you have already covered similar topics in detail, how could you possibly be so ignorant of this?

It is absolutely clear to me that the vaccine passports really are the Mark of the Beast. On one hand, it is understandable that a prediction coming true would seem to be convincing evidence of a religion being true. On the other hand, Deuteronomy 13, especially verses 1–5, warned us in advance about this kind of thing (emphasis added in bold):

¹Everything I command you that you shall be careful to do it. You shall neither add to it, nor subtract from it. ²If there will arise among you a prophet, or a dreamer of a dream, and he gives you a sign or a wonder, ³and the sign or the wonder of which he spoke to you happens, [and he] says, "Let us go after other gods which you have not known, and let us worship them," ⁴you shall not heed the words of that prophet, or that dreamer of a dream; for the Lord, your God, is testing you, to know whether you really love the Lord, your God, with all your heart and with all your soul. ⁵You shall follow the Lord, your God, fear Him, keep His commandments, heed His voice, worship Him, and cleave to Him.

For this reason, neither impressive miracles nor impressive predictions are truly...impressive. As Rabbi Tovia Singer says, miracles are produced by every religion and “are not a barometer of truth.” We have to always ask this: what is G-d's opinion?

As for my own view on the modern issue of the Mark of the Beast, I believe the globalists are modeling their plan of attack after the Christian Book of Revelation. In this way, they feel assured that we will not find their jugular vein: repentance on a societal level. Christians are trained to believe that it is impossible to stop the NWO; it's part of their New Testament. For this reason, activism efforts to stop it would seem, to the Christian, futile. A rallying cry of the Sixth Lubavitcher Rebbe was “immediately to repentance, immediately to redemption.” It's as simple as that. Repentance, by the way, involves changing your actions! It is such a powerful force that it will put the dictators out of a job—forever.

The globalists have engineered sin into our society because they believe this will keep them in power indefinitely. Similarly, they have infiltrated and otherwise controlled the alternative media; it's called “controlled opposition.” With their “trusted influencers,” they have also sneaked their way into religious organizations. My take on it is this: if you don't like the NWO, they want you in a church. They are betting that you'll never see the blatant Bible-tampering so thoroughly laid out in Rabbi Singer's book and realize that the Orthodox Jews (and the Noahides) have been right all along and were never waiting for a man to be G-d or G-d to appear in the form of a man or anything like that. The Christian view is that everyone should

wait for G-d to do something for the world to be fixed up. The Jewish view is that mankind has to correct its actions for the Final Redemption to occur.

Christians read their Bible reverently and would surely take seriously the admonition at the end of the New Testament that no one may add or subtract from the words. But what if that wasn't the first time that admonition was given? As it turns out, it's not the first time!

||²Do not add to the word which I command you, nor diminish from it, to observe the commandments of the Lord your God which I command you. (Deuteronomy 4:2)

And if you look at the first time Deuteronomy was quoted in this tri-fold (where Deuteronomy Chapter 13 was quoted above), you'll see that it's not the only place where this warning is given. Verse 1 includes: "...You shall neither add to it, nor subtract from it."

So if history's greatest prophet, Moses, wrote that nothing may be added to or subtracted from the Torah and somebody else later wrote something new, with a similar admonition that nothing may be added or subtracted, you really owe it to yourselves to consider whether the second admonition, the second admonition not to add or subtract, was authentic. Christianity would have the burden of proof and it does not pass that test. Rabbi Tovia Singer's book will explain all of this and many, many other questions. This brochure is only intended to direct you to his book, *Let's Get Biblical! | Why Doesn't Judaism Accept the Christian Messiah?*, which currently has two volumes. If you don't want to financially support his organization, Outreach Judaism, by buying new copies of Volume 1 and Volume 2 from the source, just buy them used.

Note: The simple fact that the books of the Prophets (like Isaiah and Jeremiah and Ezekiel) and the Writings (like Proverbs and Psalms) in the *TaNach*, the Jewish Bible, came after/were written after the Five Books of Moses does not mean that they fit the description of the false prophet in Deuteronomy 13. King David and Ezekiel and Jeremiah and Isaiah did not say that the Torah was a curse or that it was abrogated or that we should follow false gods/worship idols, whether or those idols are wood, metal, stone, human, conceptual, or something else. The law for the Jews is outlined in the Five Books of Moses and, since Mt. Sinai, that can't ever be changed. The Prophets and the Writings are books intended to help improve mankind's service of G-d. The Christian New Testament seeks to destroy/replace the Five Books of Moses. *TaNach* is a Hebrew acronym for Torah, Prophets, and Writings.

(2) The abortion ritual performed by Satanists is an inversion of the Christian communion service. So doesn't this also clearly prove that Christians have it right?

Just like in the Mark of the Beast scenario described above, controlled opposition is a real phenomenon and it sometimes makes use of reverse psychology. In effect, a Satanist is 'saying,' with his actions, "Don't be a Christian" by doing this sort of abortion ritual. He is confident that his actions will drive his detractors, those who oppose and are disgusted by what he is doing, right into the arms of Christianity. So those who like/approve of what he's doing will be tempted to do just the same; those who oppose what he's doing will be tempted to follow a false religion.

Further, as explained by Rabbi Yitzchok Dovid Smith, fear on the part of Noahides or Orthodox Jews about those who are involved in the occult would be similar to idolatry because it would imply belief in more than one power (the only power being G-d Al-mighty). There is a pervasive mistake in Christianity that people often believe that G-d is merely going to win in

the end and that the devil is the [false] god of this world. It's not true; G-d is in complete control of everything at all times. So Christians should not only read Rabbi Singer's book and prove to themselves that someone has been playing with their Bible, but they should also not fear Satanists and the occult (though they should continue to distance themselves from the occult, of course). The right perspective is to be sad/dissatisfied that other people believe in the occult as having any ultimate power, which it does not, as shown very clearly in the showdown between Elijah the Prophet and the [false] prophets of the Baal at Mt. Carmel. But we should not just remain dissatisfied with that and then do nothing. Instead, we have to educate mankind with the truth.

So, yes, it is true that some Satanists have publicized that they have a “my body,” “my blood,” “my will” ritual related to abortion, a bizarre form of child sacrifice, and this certainly is or appears to be an inversion of the Christian communion service, but this does not prove that Christianity is true. I would suggest that readers should consider the more likely explanation, the reverse-psychology explanation, while they read Rabbi Tovia Singer's book and check the references. This is the most efficient way I know of today to reach the right conclusion and become a Noahide. I didn't have to learn a word of Hebrew or Greek to see the blatantly obvious Bible tampering.

(3) Such-and-such large company put “The Beast,” “666,” etc. in their advertisement, logo, etc. Doesn't this prove something?

Think of all the frightening FAQs in this tri-fold as a whole: the fact that it is very reasonable for all of these to be asked at this juncture in history means that somebody wants large numbers of Americans to believe that the end-of-the-world scenario predicted by Christianity is happening now. While on the surface it may appear that the opening ceremony of the UK Commonwealth Games was a plain-and-simple occult ritual, one would be most negligent not to consider that such a production is intended to produce a certain reaction both in those who approve of/do not oppose the production as well as in those who oppose it. What would be the knee-jerk reaction of those learning about such a ceremony who oppose that sort of thing? To be Christians. But the proper reaction is to go ahead and read Rabbi Tovia Singer's book and verify that the Orthodox Jews and Noahides are the only ones that have the true religion and that the Bible-tampering that resulted in Christianity is easily seen for those who know where to look. Those at the top of the leadership of those organizations and companies (or those pulling their strings) must certainly be aware that only one religion acknowledges that G-d made an Instruction Manual for Mankind that can and must be kept. They must be aware of this because it is the only thing that can stop them; once mankind is no longer deserving of oppression, all dictatorships will end. It is my belief that the globalists are using both the language/word choice/key terms and the predictions (e.g. “The Beast,” “666,” “no buying or selling without the Mark of the Beast/vaccine passport”) of the heretofore-dominant religion in the USA to terrify those who oppose them into being Christians. Orthodox Judaism (which, for non-Jews, means being a Noahide) may seem like a “penny-stock” religion since smaller numbers believe in it, but it's the only true one.

In practice, what would be the result of large numbers of people adopting Christianity or readopting it if it is something from which they turned away? What kinds of actions would result? In general, missionizing activities would be the result and most would believe that political activism efforts, legal efforts, etc. would be futile (which doesn't mean that they would all stop activism and legal efforts, since it's clear that some sincere Christians today are doing

this; Dr. Sherri Tenpenny and Dr. Russell Blaylock are examples, just to name two). All Christians necessarily believe their efforts to stop the NWO will fail even if they fight against this belief. This assumption is also built into their view of the war against the Evil Inclination.

On both fronts, they have been told that they cannot win. The results of a large increase in Christianity, therefore, would probably be that little repentance would happen on a national level. The dictators feel assured that this will guarantee they will stay in power forever, because repentance on a national level is what will put them out of a job. Some of the dictators do know that Orthodox Judaism has always been right, so they want to push you into Christianity.

(4) Aren't you merely being ungrateful to G-d? Don't you know His son died for you on the cross?

I'm very grateful to G-d. As Rabbi Singer's book shows very clearly, the Jewish Bible proves it is impossible for the economy of salvation promoted by Christianity to be the real one. With his book and your copy/copies of the Christian Bible, you can easily verify this yourself. That's what is at the core of this discussion. Ask yourself:

What is G-d's economy of salvation? How I would I know? (You don't want man's opinion; you want G-d's opinion, and that is to be found in Scripture.)

I recommend that you set your emotions aside and and just work on finding the truth. The question of whether someone died a gruesome death at the hand of the Romans and whether that has something to do with G-d's economy of salvation are two different questions. G-d doesn't require that you surrender your critical thinking skills; you know this because you saw that there is no penalty from G-d for being a conspiracy theorist. Rabbi Yitzchok Dovid Smith says there are two and only two real credentials in today's world: honesty and common sense. You have both. You are qualified to make this investigation, period.

(5) What about Isaiah 53, Daniel 9, and other proof texts?

Rabbi Tovia Singer's book neatly answers all of those questions. You should know that when I began to ask the Christianity vs. Judaism question and Rabbi Singer was recommended by a Noahide friend, I just started out by listening to some of his lectures on the YouTube. While these were interesting, I wasn't really able to make anything out of them and I believed I was in for a long journey of trying to find the answer (this is mainly because he was covering more intermediate topics in the specific videos that I happened to click on). The format of the book is different than a lot of these question-and-answer sessions and makes it extremely easy for any Christian to address and answer all of the most important questions in a very short time. There is simply no substitute for sitting down and checking the references as you go along in his book, which is a study guide in itself; that is the only thing that will be convincing to someone asking the question of whether Christianity is the product of Bible tampering. It is. It would be a mistake to think you won't easily be able to reach a conclusion in a relatively short time. "How did I not see this before?" is a typical result for a reader.

Rabbi Tovia Singer's website is OutreachJudaism.org; his books may also be purchased used from third parties by those who are not sure whether they want to financially support his organization by buying new (understandable because his countermissionary work is either the best thing ever or the worst thing ever in the eyes of someone new to this topic).

He has also generously made his 24-part *Let's Get Biblical!* audio series, a companion to the two-volume book series, available for free. In my own experience, it was very useful to listen to these, but was in no way a substitute for sitting down with the study guide, his book. In my view, the priorities would be:

- (1) the book
- (2) the 24-part audio series
- (3) everything else, including articles on the Outreach Judaism website and YouTube videos including the many call-in questions he receives on wil'Liam Hall's show, Tenak Talk.
