

**SAMPLE of NEW TESTAMENT "ERRORS":**

**RABBI TOVIA SINGER** claims that "errors" are prominent in the New Testament. **Let's look.** 🕒

**Number of people descending to Egypt:**

Rabbi Singer claims that the New Testament cannot be a holy document if it contains simple numerical errors such as the wrong number of people descending to Egypt during the famine in the days when Joseph is viceroy:

- New Testament:** Acts 7:14: "...75..."
- Old Testament:** Genesis 46:27: "...70."
- Old Testament:** Exodus 1:5: "...70..."
- Old Testament:** Deuteronomy 10:22: "...70..."

I'm not sure what to say about this one. At a surface level, it looks like a good point.

**Location of Tomb of the Patriarchs:**

Rabbi Singer also claims that the New Testament cannot be a holy document if it contains the wrong location for the Tomb of the Patriarchs.

- New Testament:** Acts 7:16: **Shechem**
- Old Testament:** Genesis 23:17-19: **Hebron**
- Old Testament:** Genesis 50:13: **Hebron**

This is also a good point. But as we will see, Rabbi Singer uses all of these arguments in his work to tell people they should not believe in Christianity.

**John the Baptist: Elijah or not?**

Rabbi Tovia Singer points out that there appears to be some type of contradiction between two New Testament passages:

John 1:21: **John says he's not Elijah.**  
 Matthew 11:11-14: **Jesus says John is Elijah.**  
 This is a fair point, too. But Rabbi Singer is basically using this to convince us to believe in Judaism over Christianity.

**SAMPLE of ADDITIONAL PROOF TEXTS:**

**Zechariah 12:10:**

Rabbi Singer claims that John 19:37 changes the wording of Zechariah 12:10 from "They shall look to Me..." to "They shall look on him..." Yes, this is a reasonable observation to make and I can't refute it. But obviously, Rabbi Singer is using this text to convince people to believe in Judaism.

Do you want your congregation reading Rabbi Singer's work or do you want to 'make sure' they never find it? Do you think it would lead them astray? Only you can make the choice to read his work and examine his "fantastic" claims for yourself. *Hatzlachah rabbah* (much success)!



**ABOUT:**

**THE READER** may have correctly guessed by now that this flier was not made by a Christian. **Surprise!** (or not) I've noticed that the main obstacle for Christians in learning Rabbi Singer's work is just getting started.

Therefore, it seemed right to use the approach that was used by Caleb during the episode of the returning group of spies bringing a discouraging report. At first, he pretended to be an opponent of Moses and the crowd grew quiet and listened carefully, thinking he was about to launch a criticism. He then made a truly impressive defense and encouragement. He defended Moses and essentially said the people should be brave and ready to conquer the Land. He did so because he expected that without this strategy, he'd be 'shouted down' before he could finish speaking.

Maybe the reader would do well to re-read this tri-fold from its cover to its end, knowing now that the extremely abbreviated points outlined here are actually meant to start critical thinking processes and generate interest in actually reading Rabbi Singer's work, which was the only way I found efficient for me personally in addressing this question.

The two-volume book can be purchased used from a third party if the reader isn't sure whether Rabbi Singer's work is "the best thing ever" or "the worst thing ever" in answering this question: both sides know everything is at risk. Buying new will support Outreach Judaism, his organization.

**A little cleverness vs. much deception:**

The method used long ago by Paul to promote Christianity and used today by messianic groups such as "Jews for Jesus" is a different approach than the one used in this flier. The strategy used by Jews for Jesus has been to act a lot like chameleons and to do so for a period of years, saying that they are "fulfilled Jews" or "completed Jews" and not admitting they're certainly Christians in a cloak of Judaism.

In contrast, this flier could lead the reader to assume for perhaps 10 minutes that the author is a Christian and then discloses at the end that he's a Noahide. That's called having a sense of humor and it's called successfully getting the reader to admit, "Yeah, it's true. I probably would have thrown this away if I didn't think you were a Christian warning me against Rabbi Singer's work instead of a Noahide promoting it."

**Be efficient in your investigation:**

The simple truth: I didn't have the discipline in 2017 to listen to Rabbi Singer's free 24-part audio series and/or his free interviews/shows/lectures online, take careful notes, and use them to verify diligently and reach my conclusion. I'd probably still be wondering if my friend was right or wrong had it not been for actually studying Rabbi Singer's two-volume book and using an invention called a bookmark. I challenge the reader to study this book and check the references, whether individually, as a family, in a Bible study group, with a pastor, with any number of honest pastors gathered together, or otherwise so you can easily see the "New Testament" is a "theological crime scene" and understand Zechariah 8:23:

**23**So said the L-rd of H-sts: "In those days, when ten men of all the languages of the gentiles shall take hold of the shirt of a Jewish man, saying, 'Let us go with you, for we have heard that G-d is with you.'"



**Volume 1**, the study guide, might only take three months/90 days for an individual reader, a family, a pastor, a Bible study group, or a panel of pastors to complete if using a bookmark and reading at a rate of about 5 pages per day. **Volume 2** is a question-and-answer (Q&A) book that addresses smaller, related topics. It's slightly shorter and much faster to read.

### The book's back cover:

Christians should be aware that the back cover of the book includes the following very convincing quotation that might actually be expected to lead people to read Rabbi Singer's book and find out what is waiting for the reader inside:

"Pastor, can you listen to these tapes and tell me if everything this man is saying is true?" ## THE NOAHIDE MOVEMENT:

**RABBI TOVIA SINGER** estimates that the Noahide movement, currently seeing exponential growth, may now include as many as...

**... 1 million human beings worldwide.**

**Noahides** are non-Jews who have chosen to keep the Seven Laws of Noah, which are much like the Ten Commandments. They learn from Orthodox rabbis instead of from pastors. They have a place in the World to Come. They are not Christians. They are also not Jews but they can become Jewish/convert to Orthodox Judaism if they determine that is right for them.

Do you know any Noahides?

Rabbi Singer claims that the people who become Noahides are, by and large, the most learned, most sincere Christians and, in political terms, tend to be very conservative individuals.

## JEWES LEAVING THE CHURCH:

**MANY JEWS** also have left Christianity as a result of Rabbi Tovia Singer's work or the work of other counter-missionaries such as Rabbi Michael Skobac from Jews for Judaism.

**Orthodox Jews** are very educated adherents of Judaism and are the type which fully keep the Torah, in contrast with the other Jewish groups which left Torah observance and said they were essentially too modern to keep certain parts of it. Rabbi Singer's work highly successfully convinces Jews to be Orthodox Jews and non-Jews to be Noahides. Believing Christianity to be a religion based on Bible-tampering and associated historically with persecution, both Orthodox Jews and Noahides are very resistant (immune, it seems) to the messages of Christianity. That is thanks to the work of people such as Rabbi Tovia Singer.

## SAMPLE of RABBI SINGER'S POINTS:

1. *The Messiah is the first man to resume the Davidic line of Israel's kings and is not God.*
2. *"Someone's been playing with my Bible": Christianity is based on doctoring of the Scripture.*
3. *New Testament totally incompatible with the Jewish Bible/Hebrew Bible/Old Testament.*
4. *Teachings of Moses and teachings of Paul are opposite: "We're [Jews are] going with Moses every time."*
5. *New Testament internally inconsistent/ New Testament contradicts itself.*
6. *God's economy of salvation essentially based on repentance, not human sacrifice.*



## SAMPLE of PROOF TEXTS:

**RABBI TOVIA SINGER** claims that no Christian proof texts support Christianity. **Let's check.** ↪

Isaiah 53:

Rabbi Singer regularly says that Christians tend to read this chapter in isolation (without the surrounding chapters) and tend to be unaware that these are the "servant songs" which refer to Israel as God's servant, e.g. Isaiah chapters 41, 44, 45, 48, 49. This is actually a good point. He also claims that "by his wounds we were healed" (53:5) refers to the strange phenomenon that when there has been Jewish suffering in the world, it has led to repentance of the non-Jewish nations. A prime example was the Holocaust. It's fair to say that antisemitism was more socially acceptable in the USA before the Holocaust. But after the Nazis did such evil in the world, anyone hating Jews would have had to do so privately or else risk the inevitable, "What, are you some kind of a Nazi or something?" This is also a good point. Now let's take a look at some more arguments Rabbi Singer has been using to lead people away from Christianity.

Daniel 9:

R' Singer's book claims Daniel 9 doesn't support Christianity!

Isaiah 7:14/virgin birth concept:

Rabbi Singer claims that Isaiah 7:14 does not, in the original Hebrew, refer to any virgin but that the wording there refers to a "young woman." He says that most Christians can't read the Hebrew and cross-references passages using the same word or root word: Proverbs 30:18-20, I Samuel 17:56, I Samuel 20:22. I have to admit these are excellent points.

Further, Rabbi Singer explains that idolatrous cults of the ancient world believed in some version of a man-god who was part man and part God and was born from a virgin. This is also a very good point because the Greeks and Romans had as examples of this belief: Alexander the Great; Romulus, the founder of Rome; Augustus. Such beliefs were also commonly applied in Hinduism; in Buddhism; in Zoroastrianism/Persian belief; in Egypt; and to many Greco-Roman deities. Rabbi Singer claims the early church sought out pagan non-Jews with the virgin birth narrative because its efforts had failed at reaching Jews. At first glance, this seems like a great point. But there are more proof texts Rabbi Singer makes claims about:

"...according to the scriptures":

Rabbi Singer claims that there is no such scripture in the Old Testament/Jewish Bible/Hebrew Bible as referenced in I Corinthians 3-4 predicting Jesus of Nazareth rising on the third day. Honestly, this is a fair point. Anyone would have to make a stretch to say that this points to Jonah's time in the whale.

Rabbi Singer also points out that the Book of Jonah is one that strongly supports his repentance-centered Jewish message because the people of the non-Jewish city of Nineveh repented and were forgiven right away, no sacrifice necessary. This is another one of Rabbi Singer's many strong points and it would be very hard, maybe impossible, to refute.
